Message From The President

Thank you to all who responded to my request for thoughts for our April Sweepstakes! The consensus is to have something definitely with a spring theme and something familiar--so the sweepstakes will be:

A design incorporating spring plant material in the exhibitor's choice of design style, Exhibitor must state the design style on the card, i.e. line-mass, mass, pot-et-fleur, modern mass, Hogarth Curve, cascade, etc. Design may not exceed 20" in width, no height restrictions. Man made materials may be incorporated but No Artificial plant material is permitted. Designs must be placed between 10:00 am and 10:30 am. Viewed and judged from the front.

This allows each exhibitor to choose a design style that they want to create, but when you state your style, you should be careful to carry out the characteristics of that particular style. That would be part of the judging criteria. I think it will be fun and interesting to see what exhibitors choose to do and show a diversity of designs!
