# Another Halloween Ghost Story



#### Tools

Clippers

#### Supplies

18-24+" clear cylinder vase 18" diameter clear glass vase for the base

#### Plant Materials

2-3 Stems of Milkweed ( Asclepias syriaca ) 24+ Mini White Pumpkins ( Cucurbita pepo )

#### Technique

- Here is a really quick and so easy Autumn design. You will have it completed in minutes. Gathering your materials will take a bit longer.
- Now is the time to collect your Milkweed pods/stems. They are ghost-like as they open to expel their seeds on the wings of the white, fluffy hairs (also called the floss, pappus, coma, or silk) that are attached to each seed and facilitate their wind dispersal.
- Make sure you have adequate number of the Mini White Pumpkins to place around the base glass vase.
- Yes, just these two items are all that you need for your all white, ghostly apparition design.
- HINT: Be sure to remove the white fluff from all the pods that will sit outside
  of the vase. They can easily become airborne inside your home. Keep the
  opened and escaping seeds inside the tall cylinder where air currents will
  not affect their movement, by keeping them inside the glass.
- Place your mini white pumpkins around the base container
   AND... Violal your design is complete. Your design will last into the Autumn and when Winter arrives substitute pine cones for the pumpkins and the milkweed fluff can begin a new life as it imitates snow.
   A design for many seasons. Have fun.

Meet at St. Anthony Church at 12:00 pm. Our tour will begin at 1:00. Municipal Recycling Facilities send recycled material to the O&G plant at 105 Berault Rd., Beacon Falls. It is sifted and cleaned and washed and tumbled. The end result is a "green" glass additive for cement. Traditional cement additives are becoming scarce and expensive, plus they emit CO2 into the atmosphere. This new cement does not. Google it! It is a fun photo opp.

**Workshop**: Join us on November 11, 10:00-12:00 for a workshop with artist/photographer Jude Ansel at 33 Mountain Lane, Farmington, home of Mara Sfara, club photography chair of Garden Club of Hartford. You will go home with a work of art. You will learn how to:


The plans for the January Projects Membership meeting are well underway. Forman School has generously offered the use of their meeting space, complete with a soup lunch.
