HORTICULTURE COMMITTEE

A reminder from Ronnie Schoelzel to all those members who planted bulbs at the October 17th workshop: Check your bulbs to make sure the soil doesn't dry out, especially if they have sent down roots. When the shoots are about 2" high, take them out of the dark and place them in a cool spot to acclimate to light, and make sure to water when the soil dries out.
